Assessment criteria

- Expected duration:
Until the next review of Government / DfE – 26.01.2022
- Health and safety:
Y7 & Y8 to wear face masks at all times whilst on the school premises – excluding whilst eating and drinking.

Y7 & Y8 to complete lateral flow tests in school on 05.01.2022 from 08:15.

Y7 & Y8 to complete lateral low tests twice weekly at home.

Covid 19 Risk Assessment updated 04.1.2022 (V13)

Boosters are to be offered to 12 to 15 year olds.
- Impact on people (welfare, transport):

Staff – personal choice if wear a face mask whilst teaching in the classroom.

2 metres to be maintained as much as practically possible from pupils.

Fully vaccinated staff and pupils that have been in direct contact with a positive cases/s are not required to self-isolate but must complete a lateral flow test every 24 hours for 7 days.

Staff and pupils must continue to attend school during this period.

4. Impact on buildings and property (security, cordons):

All rooms to be kept well ventilated – windows to be opened in 10-minute bursts.

5. Impact on IT and communications (network, telephony):

6. Impact on School operations/ frontline services

Staffing and bubble closures would be only if absolutely necessary and all other options exhausted

7. Possible future outcomes:

Classes could be combined and taught in the hall by 1 Teacher and supported by Cover Supervisors and Teaching Assistants.

In the event of a year group closure, vulnerable pupils are expected to still attend school. This includes those at of social and emotional risk at home.

If necessary to self-isolate, if fit to do so, you are required to teach remotely from home.

8. Potential for escalation or spread:

Staff and pupils that test positive only self-isolate for 6 days.

PCR test must be completed if showing symptoms.

Result must be emailed to office@jamesbateman.staffs.sch.uk

If test positive but no symptoms expectation is to work from home.

Lateral flow tests to be completed on day 5 and every 24 hours thereafter until 2 negative lateral flow tests are received up to a maximum of 10 days.

Lateral flow tests must be completed before 8am each day.

Return into James Bateman Middle School is expected as soon as 2 x negative lateral flow tests are received.

Return to school is expected On day 11.
